I have known Eric Scerri for many years. I first encountered him when he published my articles in the journal Foundations of Chemistry which he edits.

I have also watched him lecture to a diverse set of audiences, from professional philosophers of science, to chemists, students and members of the educated public.

In all cases Scerri displays a great sensitivity to his audience and manages to inform, entertain and provoke reflection. There is never a shortage of questions after one of Eric Scerri's lectures which he delivers in an impeccable British accent with splendid use of PowerPoint and modern techniques for engaging an audience.

For example I recently watched him addressing a general audience of about 80 people at the Faculty of Exact and Natural Sciences at the University of Buenos Aires where I am a professor in philosophy of science.
